Unfortunately, we needed to extend our membership drive through June to try and meet our approved budget, 80% of which covers your security patrol. As of July 11, we had 357 Members and nine Friends. To meet our budget target of 402 Members and maintain our security patrol at its current level, we need an additional <u>45</u> sign-ups as soon as possible. Your Board is monitoring several area developments. These include GDOT improvements to our LaVista-Briarcliff intersection and Toll Brothers' rezoning proposal to develop a new five-story 374-unit apartment complex to replace nine single-family homes on Milledge Place at the nearby Briarcliff-Clairmont intersection. Both projects will impact area traffic and, if the latter proposal is approved by DeKalb County, it will cause a 100% loss of tree canopy and require extensive stormwater retention as well. We encourage you to follow the ongoing discussions on Nextdoor and join us in providing input to our public officials!

We are also monitoring ongoing DeKalb cityhood initiatives and options (yes, that again). Since the last resident preference surveys in October and December 2014, over 164 LaVista Park homes have sold, equating to a 25%+ turnover. Stay tuned as your Board considers a new preference survey and town hall to review possible options.

Thank you to the 76 respondents who completed our Fall Festival Survey! We will share results and preliminary plans for this event at our Thursday, July 26th Quarterly Membership Meeting.

Finally, mark your calendar for our annual "National Night Out" on Tuesday, August 7, 6:00-8:30pm at the Brookforest entrance to the park. Come cool down with ice cream, enjoy music, play games, and meet your neighbors and our DeKalb police officers! All ages and pets are welcome, so bring the entire family.

Greetings to everyone from the LaVista Park Patrol Officers. We hope everyone is having a great summer!

Here are a few tips to help keep you and your property safe.

- 1) If you see suspicious activity or a crime in progress dial 911, then feel free to post the incident on social media sites.
- 2) Keep windows and doors closed and locked, especially at night.
- 3) Document model and serial numbers for your electronic devices.
- 4) Ensure that your home Wi-Fi is secure.
- 5) Change the batteries in your smoke alarms.
- 6) Have an escape plan in case of fire or other emergencies.
- 7) Thefts of weed eaters, blowers, and other lawn equipment will be on the increase. Help keep an eye on our neighbors and lawn care professionals equipment.
- 8) Secure your valuables. Hiding them is not a good way to secure them.
- Think about investing in a fire proof safe.

- 11) Meeting someone for an internet sale or purchase is dangerous. It is recommended that you meet at a local police station to complete the transaction.

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C.A.N. met on April 25th with representatives from the Community Prosecution Program in the Solicitor General's office. This new Quality of Life unit works with Code Enforcement, Health, Fire, and Watershed departments to weekly review cases scheduled for Code Enforcement Court.

The second meeting of this quarter was on May 23rd. John Greene presented findings from his work as Chief Audit Executive for DeKalb. His office has unrestricted access to all offices and personnel in DeKalb, and can independently determine areas of study. ? Did You Know?

Children's Healthcare of Atlanta announced that its subsidiary, Egleston Children's Hospital, plans to build a 446-bed pediatric hospital in DeKalb County.

Here are some facts about the project:

- The planned hospital will include two patient bed towers, which include the AFLAC Cancer and Blood Disorders Center, neo-natal intensive care units, pediatric intensive care units, and cardiac intensive care units.
- The patient towers, connected via a shared lobby, rise above five floors of diagnostic and treatment space, including surgical suits, cardiovascular suites, emergency department, interventional radiology and other critical services necessary for the hospital.
- A variety of amenities and features requested by patient families, including larger rooms with sleep areas, windows with "healing views" and plentiful access to natural light are planned. The larger and standardized patient rooms – also in line with modern medical standards – allow more technology at the patient's bedside, enable families to be more involved in their child's care, and increase flexibility to support different levels of patient needs.
- The connected clinic and office building will allow doctors to meet with and treat non-critical patients in spaces immediately

adjacent to the hospital, creating efficiency and saving time for physicians, patients and families.

- Total square footage will be more than 1.8 million square feet, including the hospital, attached clinic and office building, and central utility plant.
- The total cost will be \$1.5 billion, which includes the cost of the hospital as well as the attached clinic and office building, central utility plant, hospital- and campus-related infrastructure and associated contingencies. The cost of the hospital itself will be \$1.3 billion.
- Also on the North Druid Hills campus, the Center for Advanced Pediatrics is scheduled to open next month, and two support buildings are currently under construction.
 Completion of the support buildings in 2020 will allow Children's employees to vacate current offices on the site of the planned hospital, allowing construction to begin. The North Druid Hills hospital is slated to open in 2025.







LaVista Park / Garden Club

Well, the goats are gone...for now. As you will remember, they are a multi-year project to dampen down the invasives to a manageable level. The clearest example of that is the two halves of the park. The upper end (pond) was cleared by sheep two years ago, and then this past spring. You can see the difference in the amount of grow back between that and the lower (observation deck) area which has only been done once. As we progress year to year, it will look more and more like it did when our neighborhood was created nearly 60 years ago.

LaVista Park needs your support

We are ready for the next phase of park restoration and development: Improving the upper, street side areas of the park just above the pond patio near the corner of Wild Creek and Beech Haven. We need to raise \$12,000 to accomplish these improvements and need your help to reach that goal in the coming months.

Thanks to matching grants from Park Pride and a challenge grant from the Citadel Garden Club, fundraising is already underway: You see, every dollar we receive from LaVista Park residents will be matched up to \$6,000, so your contribution essentially counts twice!

Any size donation is appreciated: All we need is \$50 from 120 households, or \$60 from 100 households, or \$240 from 25 households. You get the point. You can donate online, and it is tax-deductible. Any amount raised over and above our goal will go toward the next visit from our goat friends. (No kidding.)

project". Choose that, then "Please use this form", then select "Friends of LaVista Park" from the drop down box.

During the past 15 years we have seen major improvements to our park, thanks to the monetary support and hundreds of volunteer hours given by LaVista Park residents, funding from the DeKalb County Parks Department, volunteers from outside organizations like Georgia Tech and non-profit organizations like Park Pride.

THANK YOU for being part of this next phase of park improvement. After all, LaVista Park is your park. It is yours to enjoy, and it adds the value and quality of life of this special place that we call home. See you in the park!
